THE ASSOCIATION IS:

A group of international railroad officers whose responsibilities and interests are concerned with the repair and maintenance of railroad locomotives and shop related equipment. The Locomotive Maintenance Officers Association (LMOA) is one of five railroad educational partners. The other educational partners are Railcar Technical Services Association (RTSA), International Association of Railroad Operating Officers (IAROO), League of Railway Women (LRW) and the Air Brake Association (ABA).

WHAT ITS PURPOSE IS:

The purpose of the Association, a non-profit organization, shall be to improve the skill and knowledge or capability of its members through education, to provide locomotive maintenance to their employers, to exchange maintenance experience and information with members of the Association, locomotive builders and the railroad supply industry and to make recommendations on locomotive maintenance procedures through technical committee reports for the benefit of the railroad industry.
